(Grades 2-6)

Before visiting Schumhl School you are encouraged to have your students read the book Meet Kit by Valerie Tripp.

Kit Kittredge is a nine-year-old girl growing up in Cincinnati, Ohio in the midst of the Great Depression. Learning about the Great Depression has more relevance than ever before due to the financial crisis our country faces today. Meet Kit serves as a great introduction to life in the 1930's and gives students a unique understanding of the extremely difficult times children faced growing up during the Great Depression. The book also does a great job of showing how many people reached out to those who were even less fortunate than they were, which gives you a great topic for a thought provoking classroom discussion before visiting Schumhl School. The book does a wonderful job of setting the stage for your visit into the past as the children take a close look at one of the most difficult times in our country's history.
